Exporting Swamp Kauri Products

The following swamp kauri indigenous timber products may be exported from New Zealand under Section 67C of the Forests Act 1949:

- Any finished or manufactured indigenous timber product, regardless of the source of the timber used in the product. This is defined as any indigenous timber product in its final shape ready to be installed or used without further processing. It may include a complete item or a component of an item (whether assembled or in kitset form) such as joinery, furniture, toys, tools, and household utensils. It does not include dressed or rough sawn timber (including veneer), mouldings, panelling, furniture blanks, joinery blanks, building blanks or similar items.
- Any personal effects.
- Any salvaged stump or salvaged root, whether whole or sawn, where the timber has been taken from an area that is not indigenous forest land. Salvaged stump or root is defined as a stump or root remaining from any timber that fell naturally or timber felled before 3 July 1989 on land that is not indigenous forest land, for example, farmland or planted forest.

Prohibited Exports

Exports of logs and woodchips of all indigenous species are prohibited. The use of indigenous timber for dunnage or packaging is also prohibited.

Export Documentation/Process

A *Notice of Intention to Export (Form ITE2)* must be submitted to AsureQuality New Zealand for all exports of indigenous sawn timber and timber products (other than personal effects and any finished or manufactured indigenous timber products).

A statement declaring the source of the timber is also required; for example, a Milling Statement number and owners name. All export consignments (other than personal effects) must be made available to a Forestry Officer for inspection.

Exporters are advised to ensure that all required documentation is complete and submitted at least 10 days prior to the date of shipping. This ensures that adequate time is available for inspecting the export consignment.

On receipt of the *Notice of Intention to Export (Form ITE2)*, a Forestry Officer will verify the source of the timber and inspect the timber (as required by s 67C (3) (a) (iii) of the Forests Act 1949).

No indigenous timber/timber product exports (other than personal effects and any finished or manufactured products) will be cleared for export by the New Zealand Customs Service without Export Approval.
