If an exporter can provide the current import conditions, and the requirements still match, the certificate and the OMARs will be moved back into the published list of export certificates and OMAR's.

1. Statutory authority

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

(i) the issue under section 60 of the export requirements for cats and dogs to Norfolk Island DOMANIEC.NF dated 21 March 2013;

(ii) the revocation and replacement of the export requirements for cats and dogs to Norfolk Island DOMANIEC.NFI 03.12.09;

(iii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for cats and dogs to Norfolk Island.

This notice takes effect from the 21th of March 2013.

2. Norfolk Island requirements

Cats and dogs exported from New Zealand to Norfolk Island must be accompanied by an official assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

Explanatory note:

If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the cats and dogs do not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the cats and dogs do not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.

- 1. Within two (2) days of the scheduled date of shipment, each animal was treated with an ectoparasiticide which is effective against ticks, fleas and lice.

- 3.3 The dog(s) has been tested, with a negative result, for *Leptospira interrogans* serovar *canicola* and *L. interrogans* serovar *icterohaemorrhagiae* within fourteen (14) days prior to the scheduled date of shipment.

- 4.1 The cat(s) has been vaccinated against feline enteritis within six (6) months of the scheduled date of shipment.

NOTES: This export certificate replaces the previous one dated 1 March 2013. Changes made were to update the certificate to match the import conditions and to add an owner declaration form for cats. The export certificate was agreed by the Norfolk Island Administration on 1 February 2013.

1. An Import Permit must be obtained from the Chief Administrative Officer, Administration Offices, Kingston, Norfolk Island 2899. Tel: 6723 22001, Fax: 6723 23177.
2. The Import Permit must accompany the animal.
3. In the case of a cat(s), should the animal be too young to be de-sexed at the time of shipment, the owner undertakes that the de-sexing will be done when the cat(s) reaches the age of six (6) months.
4. Clause 2. In the case of cats, particular attention for external parasites must be given to the forelegs, chest, neck, head, ears, eyes, mouth, shoulders, axillae, inner thighs and interdigital spaces.
5. Clause 3.1. Fully vaccinated means they have completed the full course of vaccinations as per the manufacturers' recommendations and is up to date. The date of the most recent vaccination should be recorded on the export certificate.
6. The term 'disease' in the Owner's Declaration part refers to infectious diseases.

Section 61.A of the Animal Products Act 1999 states that 'The Crown is not liable, and nor is the Director-General or any employee of the Ministry liable, for any loss arising through the refusal or failure of the relevant authority of an overseas market to admit export animal material or animal product to that market'.
